



You may wish to attach the sides of the pocket to the side of the flap to help keep the pocket closed. This looks like what they did on the screen used version.



Right Pocket Shown Left Pocket Opposite

The pocket looks to have had been topstitched to the jumpsuit on the screen used version. Also this looks to be the easiest way to do it.



Right Pocket Shown Left Pocket Opposite  
 Turn pocket inside out to sew corner seams.

Extra material has been added here to aid in attaching pocket flap to jumpsuit.

You Can either use a double or single row of stitching to attach flap to jumpsuit. Both were used.



The main body of the pocket is made from one piece of material. Unfortunately the pattern for the pocket was too large to fit on one page so I needed to break it down in two pieces. Cut out the pattern pieces and match the "A" & "B" up and tape the two pattern pieces together in order to complete the pattern.



I have added about  $3/8$ " all the way around to account for the seam allowance (the dashed line).  
Sew pocket flap inside out leaving top end open. Then turned right side out.
